MCC PHOTO ID CARD

Your MCC photo ID card is a high-tech, multipurpose identification card with a full color digitized photo of yourself.

SMOKING POLICY

Smoking is prohibited inside the Sibley Building and within 15 feet of the Sibley Building entrances on Main Street, Franklin Street (near the Liberty Pole) and South Clinton Avenue. All students and employees of MCC and other tenants of the Sibley Building are asked to use the designated smoking area at the rear of the Sibley Building, located on the sidewalk that runs alongside St. Joseph's Parking Garage on the first level.

DAMON CITY CAMPUS SECURITY
